Important Information for those still using version 1

The final transfer of centres from Promise version 1 to 2 will commence on [Friday 3rd December 2004](#). We have recently emailed all Promise 1 users to warn them that Promise 1 Data Entry would be frozen around this date. The data conversion / transfer will take approximately one week. Following this we will contact you to announce that Promise 2 access is open to your centre.

Your personal passwords will be transferred to the new system along with your data, however we will email you a revised username. NB: current users need not re-apply to use the new version.

Update: ProMISe 2 users

Data Entry Navigation for [MED-B follow up](#) is almost finished! We will post a message on the Promise 2 logon page when the MED-B follow ups are ready to use. (Remember to report any errors using the method described in the following section).

How to report errors / bugs

Thank you to all volunteers who have been reporting feedback since Promise 2 was launched in Summer 2004. We would like to remind all current users that this is still a relatively new system and occasionally there may be programming errors that have not yet been reported. If you find that you are not being directed to the correct item in data entry please follow these instructions to report errors:

We will need a screen shot to show us the patient ID and where the error occurs in the MED-AB structure. This is all the info we need and it takes seconds to do:

[If something goes wrong, please press the \[Print Screen\] button immediately on your keyboard \(without saving\), plus Ctrl-C to copy. Then open Word and press Ctrl-V to paste the screen into a document that can be emailed as an attachment to <\[shelley.hewerdine@ucl.ac.uk\]\(mailto:shelley.hewerdine@ucl.ac.uk\)>. After this you can return to data entry to save your data up to that point.](#)

Subsequent Transplants

An advantage of Promise 2 is that you no longer have to create a UIC ending in 1,2,3 etc. To enter a subsequent treatment or assessment (follow up) for an existing patient. please load that UIC from the Index. When the form has loaded in the Editor, enter the 1st field: "type of form you entering?" e.g. MED- B ; follow up, and proceed from there. As you press [Enter] or [Tab] the cursor will go straight to the relevant fields rather than having to re-enter all historical data

Hint: "Ignoring Dynamic Filters"

In data entry, you will be following an item filter according to the type of form you are entering. If you are entering MED-A but wish to add a few MED-B items, please switch off the option "Ignore Dynamic Filters" in Actions & Layout to the right of the form. Remember to switch it back on afterwards!
